Question Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you

from the love of God?

Answer I renounce them.

Question Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your

Savior?

Answer I do.

Question Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Answer I do.

Question Do you promise to follow and obey him as your

Lord?

Answer I do.

After the Erin has been presented, the Priest addresses the congregation saying

The Priest then says

Priest The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Priest Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
People It is right to give him thanks and praise.

The Priest says

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise.

In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

At the following words, the Priest touches the water

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from

sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior.

To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. Amen.

BAPTISM

Erin Joy, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Erin Joy, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. Amen.

A candle is lit from the Paschal Candle and presented to each newly baptized by the Deacon.

Assisting Priest: You are the light of Christ.

Assisting Priest: Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon your servant Erin the forgiveness of sin, and have raised her to the new life of grace. Sustain her, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give her an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. *Amen*.

The Assisting Priest then says

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

Clergy and People together

We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.



Then the Celebrant continues

We acclaim you, holy Lord, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal your wisdom and love. You formed us in your own image, giving the whole world into our care, so that, in obedience to you, our Creator, we might rule and serve all your creatures. When our disobedience took us far from you, you did not abandon us to the power of death. In your mercy you came to our help, so that in seeking you we might find you. Again and again you called us into covenant with you, and through the prophets you taught us to hope for salvation.

Father, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent your only Son to be our Savior. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, he lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the sorrowful, joy. To fulfill your purpose, he gave himself up to death; and, rising from the grave, destroyed death, and made the whole creation new.

And, that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for him who died and rose for us, he sent the Holy Spirit, his own first gift for those who believe, to complete his work in the world, and to bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all.

At the following words concerning the bread, the Celebrant is to hold it, or lay a hand upon it, and at the words concerning the cup, to hold or place a hand upon the cup and any other vessel containing wine to be consecrated.

When the hour had come for him to be glorified by you, his heavenly Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end; at supper with them he took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Father, we now celebrate this memorial of our redemption. Recalling Christ's death and his descent among the dead, proclaiming his resurrection and ascension to your right hand, awaiting his coming in glory; and offering to you, from the gifts you have given us, this bread and this cup, we praise you.

Celebrant and People

We praise you, we bless you, we give thanks to you, and we pray to you, Lord our God.

The Celebrant continues

Lord, we pray that in your goodness and mercy your Holy Spirit may descend upon us, and upon these gifts, sanctifying them and showing them to be holy gifts for your holy people, the bread of life and the cup of salvation, the Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ.

Grant that all who share this bread and cup may become one body and one spirit, a living sacrifice in Christ, to the praise of your Name.

Remember, Lord, your one holy catholic and apostolic Church, redeemed by the blood of your Christ. Reveal its unity, guard its faith, and preserve it in peace.

Remember The Most Rev. Sean Rowe, The Rt. Rev. Ruth Woodliff-Stanley, The Very Rev. Dr. Michael Shaffer, The Rev. Dr. Jennie C. Olbrych and all who minister in your Church. Remember all your people, and those who seek your truth.

Remember all who have died in the peace of Christ, especially those commemorated in our service bulletin today and those whose faith is known to you alone; bring them into the place of eternal joy and light.

And grant that we may find our inheritance with the Blessed Virgin Mary, with patriarchs, prophets, apostles, and martyrs, with Saint Mark and all the saints who have found favor with you in ages past. We praise you in union with them and give you glory through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, all honor and glory are yours, Almighty God and Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, for ever and ever. *AMEN*.



INVITATION

At St. Mark's Episcopal Church, all desiring a deepening and reaffirming relationship with Christ are invited to come forward for Holy Communion or for a blessing. This is the table not of the Church, but of Jesus Christ. It is made ready for those who love God. Come, not because the Church invites you; it is Christ who invites you to be fed and blessed here. For He knows you by name and calls you by name.

Communion will be offered in two kinds. The wine may be received by either sipping the chalice or dipping your wafer in the wine. If you do not wish to receive the wine, please indicate that by crossing your arms over your chest when the chalice reaches you at the altar rail. Communion in one kind (in bread only) is a perfectly valid way to receive the sacrament. Gluten free hosts are available upon request at the communion rail. For a blessing, cross your hands over your chest. If you would like to have communion brought to your seat, please let an usher know.

The Feast of All Saints and All Souls

The custom of commemorating all the saints of the Church as a single celebration dates back to at least the third century. The early history of the Church is filled with stories of the heroic faith of these witnesses to Christ's truth and love. The stories of these saints— those baptized Christians of all ages and in all walks of life—are models for all Christians throughout history. On this All Saints' Sunday we hold up holy men and women in the Church who have lived lives of faithful and joy-filled service. As one of the recommended days for the Sacrament of Holy Baptism, we renew and reaffirm our own baptismal promises. And at the Lord's table we gather with the faithful of every time and place, trusting that the promises of God will be fulfilled in our lives.

In the tenth century, it became customary to recognize on a single day that vast body of the faithful who, though no less members of the company of the redeemed, are unknown in the wider fellowship of the Church. Over time, the day became associated with special remembrances of an individual's family and friends.

While All Saints' is to remember all the saints, over time, popular piety felt the need to distinguish between outstanding saints and those who are unknown in the wider fellowship of the church, especially family members and friends. Therefore, All Souls Day, commemorated on November 2 each year, became an optional observance as an extension of All Saints' Day. Many churches now commemorate all the faithful departed in the context of the All Saints' Day celebration. Therefore, today we remember:

St. Mark's 2025 Stewardship Campaign Update Campaign concludes Sunday, November 24th

During the month of October, we have conducted the first portion of our 2025 Stewardship Campaign. On September 20, I sent each of you a letter stating that we need to increase our pledge totals for 2025 at least twenty percent (20%) over what was pledged in 2024, to live into the ministry God calls St. Mark's now and in the future. As a reminder, in 2022, we had 28 individuals or families that pledged a total of \$96,920 to St. Mark's financial wellbeing. In 2023, 36 pledges were received totaling \$115,904, and in 2024, 37 pledges were received totaling close to \$130,000.

As of this past Sunday, October 27, 2024, we have received only 11 pledge cards expressing financial support for St. Mark's in 2025, with pledges totaling \$57,460.00. While this demonstrates an average increase in individual pledges of \$1,838 on a per pledge basis, we are woefully short on the number of pledges thus far received, 37 total for 2024 compared to only 11 thus far received for 2025.

On September 27, Stewardship Chair Marj Kenney-Williams mailed a letter to each of you, with a pledge card enclosed, urging you to fill out the card and return it with you 2025 pledge. If you have not yet done so, *I urge you to do so immediately*, as the vestry will be beginning its preliminary 2025 budget planning next week. *Do not wait until the end of the campaign to submit your pledge*. While the increased dollars of individual pledges thus far received is encouraging, the number of pledges thus far received is not. And frankly my friends, we are currently \$100,000.00 short of our goal. But, then again, almost two thirds of those pledging last year, have not submitted a pledge for 2025... so I remain hopeful.

In 2025, St. Mark's intends to call a full time rector, it's first in over a decade. The costs associated with a full time rector will cost St. Mark's, with salary and benefits as required by the diocese, something in excess of \$100,000. As a result, St. Mark's will need to raise and budget at least \$150,000 for 2025, to be able to afford a rector, while still paying for grounds and building upkeep, utilities, insurance, office administrator, organist, let alone pursue outreach ministries. And if everyone who pledged last year will just give a little more and the new members do their part, we should be able to demonstrate to the bishop that we are worthy of the confidence she has expressed in us.

And finally, let me reiterate something I shared in a sermon several weeks ago. I've heard people say, "well I just can't make a written commitment about what I can do financially next year, because I don't know what next year will bring." But my friends, we need you to pledge so the vestry can have a basis on which to set our 2025 budget. None of us really know what the coming year will bring, but that's not a reason not to pledge. I can assure you, if you make a pledge and something happens which prevents you from fulfilling it, just come to me and let me know. I will understand, no one else need know, and I will still love you. So don't let that be your excuse for not pledging.

It is evident from Scripture that tithing is an integral part of Christian life. So, what does the Episcopal Church say about Tithing/ Pledging?

The basic beliefs of the Episcopal Church are found in "An Outline of the Faith" commonly called The Catechism" in The Book of Common Prayer, pages 845—862. On Page 856, The Catechism tells us that the duty of all Christians is: "to follow Christ; to come together week by week for corporate worship; and to work, pray, and give for the spread of the kingdom of God."

Further, determination of "Communicants in Good Standing" is made by your priest each year per the provisions of Title I, Canon 17, sections 2 & 3 of Constitution and Canons of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States of America, which state:

Section 2(a) - All members of this Church who have received Holy Communion in this Church at least three times during the preceding year are to be considered communicants of this Church.

Sec. 3. All communicants of this Church who for the previous year have been faithful in corporate worship, unless for good cause prevented, and have been faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God, are to be considered communicants in good standing.

This Canon outlines the standard that is expected of ALL adult members of the Church and the standard which will be applied in determining who at St. Mark's is considered a member in "good standing" for purposes of election to office and/or eligibility to vote at the Parish Annual Meeting or any other time regarding matters of the Church.

My friends, *tithing* is the *primary means* by which God intended for His Church to carry out its mission in the world. Your tithes are used by the church to support the missionary work of the Diocese, support the missionary work of St. Mark's, pay the salaries of those who work in the church, and maintain the physical structures of the church. Put bluntly, when you do not tithe, you adversely affect the ability of the church to carry out these tasks.

So please, make your written financial commitment to St. Mark's for 2025, and give generously. This is the journey, requiring sacrifice, we make together in 2025, a Walk in Love.
